Arakawa City cannot collect the following items.
★Fire extinguishers ★Safes ★Motorcycles ★Automobiles ★Tires ★Vehicle batteries ★Pianos
★Medical beds ★Pharmaceuticals ★Paints ★Infectious waste ★Gas cylinders ★Petroleum (gasoline, thinner, or kerosene) ★Printing ink ★Cinder blocks ★Soil or sand ★Construction materials ★Business equipment ★Sheds that have not been demolished ★Other dangerous goods, etc.

*Please ask the store of purchase to pick up these items or ask a specialized disposal company to collect them.
*If you do not know where waste is collected, please contact the Operations Staff of the Cleaning and Recycling Promotion Division.

Please follow the rules when disposing of waste, plastics, and resources.

- ★ Please sort waste, plastics, and resources correctly as shown on the reverse side.
- ★ Please put them out by 8:00 AM on the day of collection.

★Bulky waste



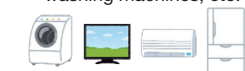
- The collection of bulky waste (furniture, bedding, bicycles, etc. larger than 30 cm) is subject to a fee and must be applied for.
- Please submit an application to the **Bulky Waste Reception Center** (☎ 03-6420-3353).
*Applications may also be submitted over the Internet.
- Please write your name or reception number on an "Arakawa City Fee-based Bulky Waste Disposal Ticket" for the disposal amount, affix it to the bulky waste, and put it out in front of your house, etc. by 8:00 AM on the collection day.
- In Arakawa City, only Arakawa City Fee-based Bulky Waste Disposal Tickets can be used. Please purchase them at convenience stores or other retailers.

★Four household appliance item categories

- Arakawa City cannot collect "A/Cs," "TVs," "Refrigerators, freezers, cold storage units, or temperature control storage units," or "Washing machines or clothes dryers."
- If you are replacing one of these items, please ask the store where you purchased the replacement item to dispose of the one being replaced. If you are only disposing of the item, please ask the store where you purchased the item to dispose of it.
- If you are unsure which store to ask for disposal, please contact the Household Appliance Recycling Reception Center (☎ 0570-087200).

Business-related waste and resources

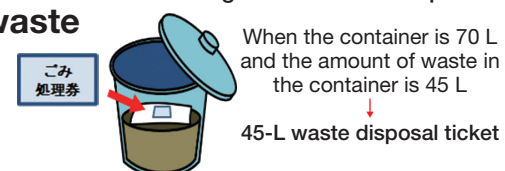
Shops, companies, F&B establishments, and other businesses **are responsible for the proper disposal of waste from their business activities.**

If you are unable to dispose of the waste yourself, you may outsource it to a waste disposal company or take advantage of collection and other disposal services provided by Arakawa city with the use of "Business-Related Fee-based Waste Disposal Tickets" issued by the city for about three 45-liter bags. (This applies to both burnable and non-burnable waste as well as resources (bottles, cans, PET/clear plastic bottles, magazines, newspapers, and cardboard boxes).) **If you would like to have resources collected, you will need to register in advance. Please contact the Operations Staff of the Cleaning and Recycling Promotion Division.**

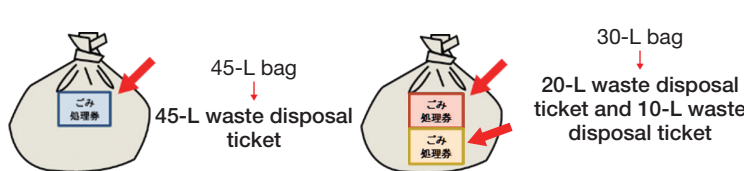
★How to dispose of business-related waste

Please sort the waste according to the sorting method of Arakawa City (see the reverse side), and affix a waste disposal ticket corresponding to the volume of waste inside when using containers for disposal, or a waste disposal ticket corresponding to the volume of waste in the bags when using bags for disposal, on the top where the ticket can be easily seen.

Styrofoam and 18-L drums ("ittokan") can be disposed of directly with a waste disposal ticket affixed directly to them without using a container or bag.

For styrofoam, one 10-L waste disposal ticket per piece
For 18-L drums ("ittokan"), one 10-L waste disposal ticket per drum

★How to dispose of business-related recyclable resources



Resource types	How to dispose of	Corresponding waste disposal ticket
Bottles, cans, and PET/clear plastic bottles	Place bottles, cans, and PET/clear plastic bottles each in separate see-through bags.	Affix waste disposal tickets corresponding to the capacity of the bags.
Newspapers and magazines	Pile newspapers (including flyers) and magazines separately and bundle them with string.	Affix a 10-L waste disposal ticket per each bundle height of 10 cm to the top of the bundle(s).
Cardboard	Fold up the cardboard and bundle them up with string.	Affix a 10-L waste disposal ticket per two pieces of cardboard to the top of the bundle(s).

*Door-to-door collection is also available for business-related recyclable resources. Please contact the Operations Staff of the Cleaning and Recycling Promotion Division.

★Business-Related Fee-based Waste Disposal Tickets

- In Arakawa City, only Arakawa City disposal tickets can be used. Please make sure to purchase them at convenience stores or other retailers in Arakawa City. Please note when purchasing waste disposal tickets that those from other cities cannot be used in Arakawa City.
- Please make sure to write the company name or trade name on waste disposal tickets.
- There are four types of waste disposal tickets (10L, 20L, 45L, and 70L), so please use them in combination according to the amount of waste you dispose of.



★Business-related bulky waste

- Arakawa City does not collect business-related bulky waste. Please ask a private disposal company to dispose of the waste.
- If you do not know a disposal company, etc., please contact the Operations Staff of the Cleaning and Recycling Promotion Division.
