How to Properly Dispose of Home Health Care Waste

With advances in medical technology, more and more people are receiving home health care.

Along with this, medical waste from households is also increasing.

Since medical waste includes items that may cause infection or leads to worker injury, please discharge it in the correct manner.

Burnable waste

- Products that are mostly non-metallic (plastic, rubber, non-woven fabric, etc.) and have no contents or stains on them.
- Never take out syringe needles. Please see the reverse side for instructions on how to dispose of





Eye drops and nasal drops



Syrup medicine bottles (made of plastic)



Tubes



Enteral nutrients (pouch type)



IV bags



Diapers and ostomy bags [Note] Please remove any contaminants.



Syringes (made of plastic) [Note] Please remove the needle portion and return it to the medical institution, pharmacy, etc. where it was purchased or prescribed.

Non-burnable waste

Products that are mostly made of metal or are entirely metal or glass. (Ex.: Small pieces of machinery no larger than 30 cm)





Thermometers and other measuring instruments

Syringes (made of glass)



Ointment containers (cans, bottles, and aluminum containers)

Plastics

- Items containing a plastic mark (セラミ).
- Items entirely made of plastic.
- *Please dispose of items with blood on them or items that may be infected as "burnable waste" as they do not apply as plastic waste even if they are made of plastic.

- Please soak any unused contents (liquid) in a cloth and dispose of it as "burnable waste."

- Please wash the inside of resources with water before putting them out to the "Resource Collection Site."
- Only "cans and bottles of oral medication, etc." can be disposed of as resources.
