


Odai-bashi Bridge

Near the Arakawa Yijen Amusement Park lies the waterbus station for Sumidagawa River's Tokyo Mizube Line (special operating hours on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays). On the nearby railings is a glockenspiel which when the keys are struck from left to right in turn, plays a traditional Japanese song called Hana (Flow-



Adachi City

Contains stone structures beginning with two Himachikuvo Towers with inscriptions from 1669 and 1705, a Jizobosatsu with an inscription from 1643, a Koshin Tower, and other stone structures built in the Edo Period. Temple festivals are held on "Days with 2's", on the 2nd, 12th and 22nd of each month, believing this to be good for long life and child rearing, and a festival is held every vear on July 12.

6 Hōzōin Temple (3-16-19 Nishi-Ogu)

The main image is of Kokuzobō satsu, and there are modern landscape paintings and the Amida Sanzon Shujiitabi monument etc. enshrined with a Mokuzō Fudōmyoo including a Buddhist prayer from 1691. There is also the "Komatsunagi no Ichō", to which the horse of General Tokugawa is

7 Jizōji Temple (3-10-6 Nishi-Ogu)

The main image of Kshitigarbha was reported to be made by Prince Shotoku, and is believed to be a Kosodate Jizōson (deity of pregnancy and childcare). Beginning with the opening of the hall in the first year of Horeki (1751), this was known as the Jizō Temple from 1760. The Hakkakudo includes the Sentai Jizoson, and the Yonenbutsu Kuyo Itabi engraved



8 Dairinin Temple (3-9-5 Nishi-Ogu)

The Hachimaniinia Betto Ganshoji Temple was abandoned with the Shinbutsubunri in 1875, and in 1889 the Sōtō School Nisodera Dairinin was built. In addition to the Amida Sanzon monument with an inscription of 1316, there is aldha statues etc. Every May 1, a meeting of the Daihannyakyo tendokue is held.

Believed to have been constructed in 1312 at the end of the

Kamakura Period, when Ogu came

under the Kamakura Tsuruoka Hachiman Jinja Shrine, and according

to the dedication plate on the

shrine it was rebuilt in 1385. This

became the guardian for the Ogu

area, and is known for the god of agriculture, commerce and indus-



14 Mankōji Temple (3-2-4 Higashi-Ogu)

Jodo sect Futabayama Okuin Mankoji Temple. Originally located near Ueno Shinobazunoike, but moved to this location with the construction of Kaneiji Temple In this precinct there are inscriptions dating from the first year of Eiwa (1375) on board monuments and the Koshin Tower. The precinct also includes the Futabajizō, Niwainari, and Futabaenma.



10 Sekiunji Temple (2-25-21 Nishi-Ogu)


(9) Hachiman Jinja Shrine (3-7-3 Nishi-Ogu)

An inspection of wells by priests in 1914 discovered a spa containing radium, and a hot spring was opened, with the name "Tera no Yu (Later Furokaku)" The three industries of restaurants, meeting spaces and geisha flourished, which triggered the development of the three Ogu indus-



⑤Fujimizaka (Vicinity of 3-7 Nishi-Nippori)

Of the several Fujimizaka around the city center, this was a slone where Mt. Fuji could be seen from the ground until around 2013. It was selected as one of the



11) Hachimanbori Promenade (2-23 Nishi-Ogu & Others)

This road was made when a group of children around 1988 learned during a lesson at the Ogumiyamae Elementary School of the existence of a number of rivers that were no longer flowing but which they could see on maps had provided agricultural water to Hachiman Jinja Shrine from the Otonashi River, and then asked older people about their memories of this time and decided to leave this knowl-

edge for future generations.



16 Nishi-Nippori Park (3-5-5 Nishi-Nippori)

This is a quiet park, surrounded by rich greenery, which helps you forget about the hustle and oustle of the city. In Edo times, this area was the precinct for the Seiunji Temple, and in modern times served as a cemetery for the Maeda family of the former Kaga Domain. Because of the great view from this area, it has been considered a wonderful place to relax by people since the Edo period.



12 Kezōin Temple (8-46-2 Higashi-Ogu)

Holding two monuments built in the Middle Ages within the grounds, with a number of stone towers left in place. This temple was a place of education for Kamiogu Village from the end of the Edo Period, and after the opening of Terakoya Egawado in 1845, in 1878 the predecessor of the Ogu Elementary School, the Private Tanabe Elementary School was con-



⑦Statue of Dōkan Ōta "Kaiten-isshi" (2-19 Nishi-Nippori

A bronze statue of Dokan Ota from the Muromachi Period, showing falconry from the story of 'Yamabuki no Sato". In Nippori there are the historical sites and legends of mountains such as Mt. Dokan, which took his name. The Dokan monument at Hongyoji Temple and the Nippori Funatsunagimatsu monument (formerly located in Nishi-Nippori Park) at Sejunii Temple are cultural assets of the



13 Monument of the Martyrdom of Lieutenant Sugino (5-6 Higashi-Ogu)

In 1917, Army Engineer Lieutenant Haruyoshi Sugino was struck by a gust of wind on an army flight returning from Shimoshizu to Tokorozawa, crashing into the rice fields of Ogu Village and becoming one of the first victims of air flight. This stone monument etc. was constructed to memorialize this precious



18 Nippori Fabric Town (Vicinity of Higashi-Nippori 3-chome through 6-chome)

All kinds of fabrics and textiles are available from the specialty shops that line both sides of this one-kilometer shopping street. The Nippori area is also famous for its lowprices for youth casual fashions, sometimes referred to as Nippori Casual or Nipokaji for short.
